**PPWR: Keep the August 2026 application date and uphold the Regulation's key requirements to ensure effective and compliant implementation**

As civil society organisations, companies championing reuse, consumer protection organisations, academics and universities, and communities impacted by PFAS and plastic pollution, we urge you to reject any last-minute calls to delay the application of the Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR) and reopen key provisions, including those set out in the letter sent by certain industry representatives on 29 April.

The PPWR is a key element of the EU's circular economy ambitions. By banning PFAS in food packaging, harmonising packaging labelling and setting legally binding targets for waste prevention, reuse, recyclability and recycled content, it has the potential to become a landmark circular economy law that protects public health and the environment, while promoting the long-term competitiveness of the packaging sector. We are therefore calling on you to proceed with the timely and full application of this important Regulation.

**Democratic legitimacy and respect for the EU legislative process**

The PPWR is the result of a full and rigorous co-decision process during which it underwent extensive scrutiny, public consultation and democratic debate. Calls to reopen the Regulation or delay its application undermine the legitimacy of that process and the integrity of EU policymaking. Revisiting political compromises already reached would set a dangerous precedent, weakening trust in EU law and creating permanent regulatory instability.

The Commission, through the publication of its PPWR Guidance and FAQ documents, has already provided clarity for companies to navigate and comply with the Regulation. Well-designed secondary legislation will also be important to ensure its smooth and ambitious implementation. The complexity of developing such secondary legislation must not be exploited in bad faith as an excuse to evade agreed obligations, weaken core provisions on prevention and reuse, or undermine the democratic legislative process.

## **Signatories of CEO letter dated April 29 do not represent the packaging value chain**

The CEO letter dated 29 April consists of a long list of specific lobbying demands, calling for further derogations for single-use packaging, weakening of waste prevention and reuse obligations, and the dilution of key environmental and health safeguards. This is a blatant attempt to extract additional concessions that would allow some of the biggest polluters in the packaging value chain to continue their business-as-usual practices, rather than a request for regulatory clarity to be provided via high-quality secondary legislation in support of implementation.

Importantly, the companies behind that letter do not speak for the European packaging value chain as a whole. Many packaging businesses, including large corporations which are members of the trade associations involved in this last-minute lobbying push, chose not to sign and remain committed to the successful and timely implementation of the PPWR.

Across Europe, thousands of companies are making investments in anticipation of the PPWR and are expecting regulatory stability. Any backtracking at this stage would punish frontrunners and discourage investment and innovation. This must be avoided; the competitiveness of European industry requires predictability, not uncertainty.

## **PPWR as a cornerstone of EU circular economy policy**

The PPWR, if fully implemented, has the potential to significantly reduce packaging waste and position the EU as a global leader in sustainable packaging. In particular, we wish to reaffirm the importance of the following core elements:


- **Ban on PFAS in food-contact packaging:** PFAS exposure is linked to serious health problems including cancer, infertility, birth defects and immune system disorders. At a time when PFAS pollution crises are escalating across EU Member States, the ban on PFAS in the PPWR is a critical measure to help protect EU citizens and the environment from these harmful “forever chemicals”. Any delay in the implementation of this ban would pose a major risk to the health of European consumers and threaten the safe circularity of secondary materials. The application date of 12 August 2026 must therefore be upheld. We commend the Commission's PPWR Guidance document for proposing a very pragmatic and cost-efficient stepwise approach to enforce the PFAS restriction, an approach that is supported by scientific evidence and laboratory analyses of selected food packaging. This approach should be consistently enforced across Member States until a harmonised EU testing methodology is established.
- **Bans on unnecessary and avoidable single-use plastic packaging:** The market restrictions laid down in Article 25 and Annex V of the PPWR were designed to















reduce waste at the source. The PPWR's impact assessment identified them as especially problematic because they generate high amounts of packaging waste, are difficult or impossible to recycle, and often add only marginal functional value. In addition, alternatives (packaging-free products, reusable packaging or refillable packaging) exist for all the banned single-use packaging items.

- Waste prevention and reuse requirements:** The waste prevention and mandatory reuse obligations in the PPWR are key milestones in the EU's transition to a circular economy. The pushback against mandatory reuse obligations under the PPWR reflects a continued effort by the single-use packaging industry to delay structural change. Claims that investment in reuse is prohibitively expensive overlook the fact that the sector has long benefited from massive public support for fossil fuels, virgin plastics, and chemical recycling. Requiring investment in reuse is therefore not an unfair burden, but a necessary correction that begins to internalise the real costs of disposable packaging. This transition should also be understood as an economic opportunity rather than simply a cost. Scaled, efficient reuse systems can quickly become cost-effective while delivering the substantial waste reductions that recycling alone has repeatedly failed to achieve.

We are committed to making the PPWR a success. We stand firmly alongside EU institutions in resisting this last-minute lobbying push and offer support on meaningfully implementing this crucial piece of legislation so that the EU successfully tackles the packaging waste crisis. We remain fully engaged in supporting the development of high-quality secondary legislation, so that the PPWR is implemented effectively and on time.
